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## Summary

This is the evaluation report of the inaugural Nature Play Week, created by organisations involved with Kids in Nature Network (KINN).

Nature Play Week is a new signature event that celebrates initiatives of all shapes and sizes that reconnect kids with nature and the outdoors. The week ran from 1-6 April 2014 and was a key part of Premier's Active April 2014, an entire month initiated by Sport and Recreation Victoria (Department of Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure) to get more Victorians more active, more often.

Overall, Nature Play Week was a big success. **Over 40 activities, events and workshops** were staged in the week across metropolitan and rural Victoria. **We estimate 2000 people participated in Nature Play Week.**

Participating organisations included Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne, Royal Botanic Gardens Cranbourne, Parks Victoria, The Melbourne Zoo, Healesville Sanctuary, five local councils, schools, kinders, community organisations, small education services and businesses and outdoor playgroups.

Key events included the launch at Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne and Project Wild Thing film screenings. Speakers at the launch event included Graeme Base, leading creator of picture story books; Prof. Tim Entwisle, Chief Executive Officer Royal Botanic Gardens; Christine Joy, Education Coordinator Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne and Kids in Nature Network Executive; Charles Solomon, Indigenous Program Manager Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne; Dr. Dimity Williams, Kids in Nature Network Co-founder and Health Advisor; Claudia Levey, Young Leader and Associate Professor Mardie Townsend from Deakin University.

The [50 things for Kids to do](#) brochure was also launched, giving families many more playful ways to explore nature and the outdoors at the Gardens and in their own neighborhoods.

A new Nature Play Week website was developed and a social media campaign run by KINN.

The week was particularly useful to build awareness and connections across Victoria from larger organisations to the grassroots. It functioned well as a springboard for further relationship building and collaborations as well as message development. This was evident from conversations KINN has had with enthusiastic participating organisations and with potential new collaborators.

Several participating organisations reported an increase in uptake of their regular outdoor activities and a clear enthusiasm to participate again in 2015. In September 2014, Nature Play South Australia, a new organisation funded by the South Australian Government,

launched Nature Play Week SA.

94% of organisers were organisations, 6% were individuals staging an event. Most events were held in greater metro Melbourne, but some great regional events held on Mornington Peninsula, The Grampians, Mt Baw Baw and the Geelong area. Two events were held in NSW. Events were spread across the week with most events held on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and weekends. Most events were held in the morning, some in the afternoon,

only two in the evening. 64% of events were free of charge to participants. If participants paid, price ranged from \$5-25 pp. Participants said they engaged with Nature Play Week through hearing from it through a large variety of sources: facebook, our newsletter and through various organisations and networks connected to KINN.

**Evaluations and testimonials**

16 evaluations were received from organisations holding events in Nature Play Week.

What worked well: People enjoyed the weather, and the fact that events were well received by locals. One respondent had success by including community members in the planning process. The interactivity of play experiences for children and seeing people interact was a highlight for everyone. The support offered by Council staff and community members was appreciated by many.

Challenges included: the weather was challenging for a couple of respondents. Weather in April can be mixed. One person mentioned that holding NPW on the last week of term one was tricky. One person asked to have the event held in the school holidays. Damage to vegie garden beds was mentioned as a challenge by one respondent. Running two events on one day was challenging for a couple of respondents.
